

5 Tips for Making Your App or Website More Inclusive

One billion – or 15 percent – of the world’s population has a disability. In addition, we are all aging and losing our vision, hearing, and mobility. By making your app or website more accessible, you can expand your reach and serve your existing clients more effectively.

- Choose colors carefully. (C, V, L, CB, S)
 - Use high-contrast colors.
 - Do not use color alone to express meaning.
 - Use color conventionally (e.g. green means go).
- Use adequate font size or allow for zoom. (C, P, V, L, S)
- Provide alternative ways to get information. (C, P, V, L, S)
 - Provide captioning or transcripts for any videos.
- Think about the meaning of images if they cannot be seen. (V, S)
 - Provide text or audio with the image.
- Keep the copy and any verbal or written directions simple. (C, V, L, S)
